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THE SEEDING OF OATS

Approach of Season for Sowing Brings Timely Advice from Expert Miller.

Experiments which the agricultural experiment station has been conducting throughout the state have shown that for at least the south half of Missouri the Texas red rust-proof oat is the surest yielder that can be used. In the north half of Missouri the Texas red rust-proof is also well adopted, but in this section and even in many cases in south Missouri an early variety of oats brought directly from the north will yield better. These oats should be grown at least as far north as northern Iowa, and new seed should be secured at least every other year to insure a good yield of heavy oats. Another variety

which has been shown to be quite well adapted to Missouri conditions, especially the prairie, is the Kherson oat. This is a very early variety with a medium to small growth of straw and has its value mainly on account of its early maturity, which lessens the amount of rust.

Experiments have also shown that for most conditions it is better to drill in oats rather than to broadcast them. This gives a more even growth and the increased yield will almost invariably pay for the cost of drilling. There is, also, a considerable saving of seed in drilling as compared with broadcasting.

Oats should be treated for smut to insure a satisfactory yield. The experiment station will gladly send complete directions for giving this treatment on application. The expense is very slight and, if one is not sure that seed oats are free of smut, this treatment should certainly be given.

SUGGESTS CLEAN-UP DAY FOR JASPER.

We Should Keep Pace With the Anti-Disease Crusade.

"Why don't they keep the streets a little cleaner?" You ask with deep annoyance not undue. "Why don't they keep the parks a little cleaner?" Did you ever stop to think that "they" means YOU?

It has come to be a fixed custom in most large cities, and the contagion is rapidly spreading in smaller towns, to have an annual and in some places a monthly clean-up day. At these times a concerted effort is made to banish all uncleanness. The spring cleaning up campaign has already been started in many cities, where vigorous assaults are being made on the unsanitary conditions that prevail. The cleaning-up propaganda advises, among other things, that trees and brush, etc., be burned; trash raked out of the corners and hiding places, yards thoroughly cleaned, wood stacked, piles of plank straightened, fences put in order, alleys and streets cleaned, and what ever else done that may contribute to cleanliness and tidiness. All of this will make for healthfulness as well as for comfort and appearances. In large cities the board of health usually proclaims a day for general fumigation as a fitting climax to the sanitary work proclaimed by the women's club and the city authorities.

This is a work in which the entire city is supposed to be interested and to heartily co-operate. School children should be enlisted in this work and thereby get the instruction along this line that will make them in future invaluable to the community. In southern cities every possible precaution is taken against the propagation of the mosquitoes by seeing that water is not allowed to stand in pools, gutters, old tin cans, etc. Why not have a clean-up day in Jasper? Even Mother Nature does her sweeping when the wind blows and her scrubbing when it rains. Why shouldn't we do a little along that line too? Jasper isn't a dirty town; still there is always room for improvement. If you will go up and down the streets and about over our little town with your eyes open and your mind in a receptive condition you will readily see that Jasper needs a clean-up day; there is more than one pile of old tin cans and rubbish that is a positive eye-sore.

Constantinople is the dirtiest city in the world, the only street cleaners being countless starving dogs, cats, and rats; and in every community there are people who resemble Constantinople. It is difficult for the citizen who tries to keep his premises looking half way tidy at all times to understand why there should not be an occasional clean up, why the little heaps of refuse should ever be allowed to grow into big heaps at all.

In many cities the back yards and alleys are inspected monthly. In some cities, five days of grace are given owners of vacant lots to clean them of rubbish and if not put in a slightly, inviting condition in that time they are cleaned at the expense of the owner by the issuing of a special tax bill against the offending property owners.

If you are a business man, set out a covered box for all trash from your store or office, that it may not be allowed to blow about the streets. If men must use tobacco use the gully for your cupid, not the paved street. We have seen a man arrested and fined for carelessly expectorating on a pavement in a city where sanitary

rules were strictly enforced.

It has been said, that a beautiful city is the best school of morals in the world, and a clean backyard and a sanitary home constitute the best kind of sermon to the spiritually wayward. Let's make Jasper a perfect school of morals. Let's clean up, not once but regularly, and thoroughly too.

Why not call a citizens' meeting and discuss civic questions, have a day set aside for clean-up day, have bills printed and scattered over the town? The school children could aid in this work before and after school. There are many phases to civic work, a goodly number of which are needed in Jasper, but a little handful of women can not accomplish much; we need the co-operation of the whole town. Each club or society might take up some special branch of this work. Any man who labors for his town is not doing work in vain. He is advancing his own interests, no matter in what business he may be engaged. The growth and beauty of a town naturally enhance the value of all the property therein. Duty to himself, as well as to his neighbor, ought to make it plain to every man to do all he can to forward the interest of his community.
