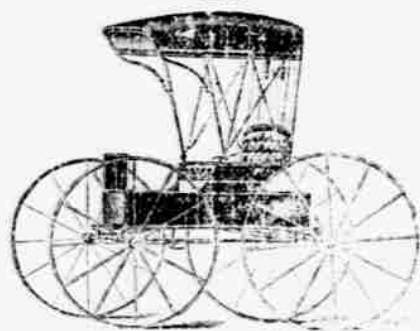

On the 12, 1843, the first church was organized. On the 21, 1841, the first town plat was filed, Oregon. In 1841 the first county treasurer, Gilbert Ray, was chosen.
