MINERAL LANDS CLASSIFIED.

United States Geological Survey Announces Reserves and Restorations.

During the month of March the United States geological survey classified 1,402 acres of coal land, with a valuation of \$20,629. It also classified 759,011 acres of withdrawn land as noncoal in character. One coal-land withdrawal of 8,-826 acres was made in Colorado, Montana, South Dakota, and Wyoming, One phosphate withdrawal of 826 acres was made in Florida. Water-power reserves were created in California, Idaho, Neva-da, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming, amounting to 10,456 acres, and restorations of 674 acres previously withdrawn for power sites were made in Colorado, Idaho, and Washington. A public water-bole reserve embracing 1,200 acres was made in Arizona.
