SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS TAKEN.

Lumber Companies and Owners Try to Lessen Fire Danger to Forests.

For lack of copious rains, the forests of the state are in a condition more dry than usual at this time of the year and special precautions are being taken throughout the state to guard against forest fires if possible. Telephone con-nections have been made with lookouts on top of several Vermont peaks and on many of them men have been stationed. patrolmen are working on the long trail between Killington and Lincoln mountains, each man covering 15 to 20 miles a day. A new association has also been formed for the express purpose of guarding against fires, its name being the Vermont Timberland Owners' association, with headquarters at Bloomfield. The principal members are the Connecticut Valley Lumber company, the Ber-lin Mills and Odell Manufacturing company. The association has engaged four patrolmen to guard its interests.

To protect its timberland, recently bequeathed to it by the late Joseph Battell. Middlebury college has put up three telephone lines and will maintain a patrolman in the vicinity of Breadloaf mountain.

Last Saturday, in Burlington, a grass fire spread over five acres of land and killed most of the small trees set out on a plantation tract a year ago. State Forester Hawes had charge of the 45 men who finally succeeded in extinguishing it. Another fire was reported to the forestry depadtment at Leceister.
