The following account of the death of Major E. T. Scott, former Burlingtonian, who died at Loma Linda, on March 18, appeared under date of March 19 in the Redlands (Cal.) Daily Facts, a copy of which has just been received:

Major Edgar T. Scott, pioneer resi summer in enlarging Hotel Windham dent of Redlands, gentleman and scholar, passed away at Loma Linda last night after an illness of several weeks. Major Scott came up from Long Beach
