TOBACCO TALK.

Rev. Alex Walker Gives His Views on the Tobacco Market.

The time has come when the farmers should be making preparation for the next crop of tobacco, and in order to be successful it is very important to begin in time to make a thorough preparation, without which the most satisfactory results will not be reached. First it is very important that all lands that have litter or vegetable matter on it be plowed in the fall or early winter, so that the litter may decompose and the soil become thoroughly pulverized by the winter frost. This is a matter too often neglected by many of our farmers, to their damage. The question now is not who can cultivate the largest number of acres, but who can realize the most money from the acres cultivated. It does seem to us that the policy of late with the majority of the tobacco raisers has not been quality, but all their energies have been employed in trying to see how much land and how many thousand tobacco hills they could cultivate with the least work and least expense. Quantity has been their chief desire, with but little regard for quality. All such have realized but small profits and often no profits at all, while those who have gone in for quality have succeeded finely and made money. It is time to call a halt on this line and go for quality and not for quantity. Plant what you can cultivate well and no more, and then be sure the cultivation is thorough; then you may confidently expect to realize satisfactory results. Thorough cultivation and proper drainage avoid in a great measure the evils so much complained of by the farmers caused by wet or dry weather. What we most need is a more thorough system of cultivation with proper drainage. We are well aware of the fact that the tobacco plant cannot stand much water, and especially standing water. It is not so much the falling water as the want of proper drainage to take the water off so soon as it falls. Therefore we believe emphasize the great importance of a system of drainage that will carry the surplus water off so soon as it ceases to fall, and if this be done, much of the damage caused by excessive wet weather will be avoided. The tobacco crop will stand a great deal of dry weather, and if the rain comes by the middle of August and favorable season on the plant will mature and make full weight. We may have something more to say on this line later on.
