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**THEATRE MANAGER ARRESTED.**

**CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., October 29.**—Paul Albert of the Chattanooga opera house, one of the best known theatrical managers in the south, was arrested yesterday charged with "publicly displaying indecent pictures." The police had prohibited the display on the bill boards of the lithograph of a girl in blue tights, brought here by Hoyt's "Black Sheep" company. He persisted and the arrest followed. The trial is set for Monday. Manager Albert yesterday sued the Evening Press for \$5,000 damages for libel in publishing articles injurious to the business of the theatre.

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After Whipping Her Father She Commits Suicide.

**TRENTON, Mo., October 29.**—News of a sad tragedy comes from a point fifteen miles northwest of this city. Farmer Sprout, prominent in that part of the state, severely whipped his son for some misdemeanor. His twin sister, Ollie, an exceedingly stout young woman, became enraged at the treatment accorded her brother and attacked her father. She broke some of his ribs and injured him so severely that his life is despaired of. The girl then, stricken with remorse, placed the muzzle of a shotgun to her breast and sent the load into her body. She died in great agony.
