Thousands Enjoy Great Singing Convention Here

West Hickory, Sept. 26.—The gospel singing convention held at the Saint's auditorium in West Hickory Saturday night and Sunday under the leadership of Prof. Joe Humphries of Gaffney, S. C., assisted by Prof. Wade Humphries and Judge L. W. Stroup, was a grand success in every way. All the quartettes as had been previously announced in the Daily Record were present and several others were added to the program. The convention convened on Saturday night and continued all day Sunday. There were about 1000 persons present Saturday night to hear the singing start and on Sunday the seating capacity of the auditorium was filled and a large number on the outside. The congregation was estimated at 2000 and I am satisfied there was that many and probably more as there were people here from all sections of the state and quite a number from South Carolina. The quartettes present were the Gaffney quartette of South Carolina, Sebren's quartette of Asheville, Prof. Hilton's quartette of Hudson, Prof. Phillips' quartette of Longview, Prof. H. Simmon's quartette of Lenoir, the Buif quartette of Casar and the Valdes quartette of Prof. Deal's quartette of Connelly Springs and probably others. As a matter of fact the choirs and many good singers of West Hickory were also present to take part in the singing.

We would be more than pleased to give full details of all the fine singing done by all the choirs and quartettes present, but that would take too much space and we will have to be satisfied with saying that the program consisted of songs by the choirs and solos, quartettes and duets and I want to say that each one whether song, solo, or quartette, was just simply elegant each one taking part in these songs showing that he was well trained in music and all doing themselves great honor in delivering their songs. All the choirs and quartettes were highly complimented by the large audience. Everyone made the remark the work was complete and that they could not see where any improvement could be made anywhere in the singing.

I think it was generally admitted without a dissenting voice that this was a great deal the best singing convention that has ever been held here. All present were immensely pleased with the fine style in which Prof. Joe Humphries conducted the service. Uncle Joe, as he is usually known here by his friends knows just how to conduct a singing convention to get the best results. He says he has been doing this kind of work for about 16 years and during that time has held between 300 and 400 conventions and he reports that he has never held a singing convention anywhere that was any better than the one held in West Hickory.

Of course Rev. Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Pve, pastor of the church, were present aiding and helping in the work and the other ministers present helping in the work, were Rev. W. R. Walker, Rev. Mr. Freeman, Rev. Brown, Rev. Harris, Rev. R. H. L. Pendleton and the ministers and all others present agreed that this was the greatest singing convention that had ever been held here.

The large audience then gave a vote of thanks to Prof. Humphries for his good work done in conducting the service. The vote was unanimous. This compliment was highly appreciated by Prof. Humphries.

Several nice talks were made during the convention by Prof. Humphries and all the ministers present made short talks, all stating that they were greatly pleased with the entire program.
