Mr. Folmester, called on next to speak, also spoke in commemoration of the Pilgrim fathers and mothers who set the precedent for the observance of a day of thanks each year. "Turn to the Right," which opened a two days' engagement at the Pastime theatre yesterday, proved a source of wholesale delight to the large audience that was present to see this fine picture.

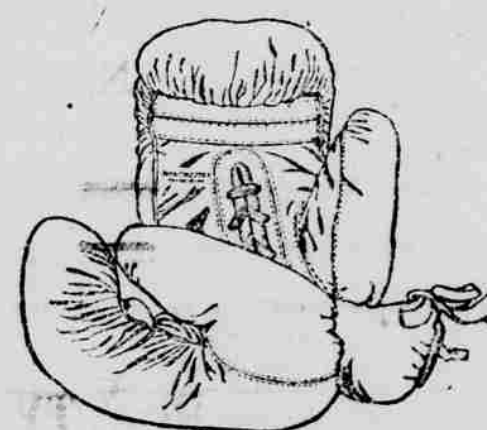

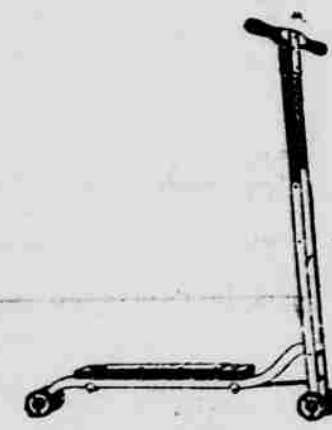
