Running true to G. O. P. forecasts Ottawa, for the first time in many deeades, flopped from the Democratic to the Republican commun, executing a feat no less than a monumental reversal in political form, which closed with a veritable landslide for the Republican office seekers, who were rushed into places at the township election by more than handsome than jorities. Literally they swamped their opponents under an avalanche of votes which no human powers could stem.

P. machinery, which fortunately had to harmonize with it, a wing o the Democratic party, that aimed it. thrusts at B. J. Shanley and William Morgan, Democratic candidates re spectively for supervisor and commissioner of highways. Running par tners of Shanley and Morgan were caught in the storm of attack, which had as its hope their complete snow ing under, and went down to defeat marking time and hopelessly unable to overcome the "split" they knew to exist in the rank and file of their own support.

The Republicans were not slow to take advantage of this situation. knowing, in view of recent national political events, that only a little work was needed to grasp the towa and shove it over into the Republican line. There are those among the vic tors who aver that the thing would have happened despite any "interior" rebellion among Democrats which caused an unmendable breach in the
