Big Peoria Outfielder is Showing Cleaning Pile for an Average of 354.  
Nesser of Peoria continues to show the way of batters in the Three-Eye. The powerful outfielder of the Peoria tribe has an average of 354 in the statistics released for publication today. Fothergill and Thompson of Bloomington are just behind him with 353 apiece. Ben Smith of Rock Island checks up in fourth position with 335, which is two points higher than the lanky first baseman boasted last week. Roy Brown of Peoria dropped from 349 to 321, and Drennon of Peoria also slumped. Brockton's batting continued to fall during the week, the big fellow slipping from 336 to 321. Benson dropped from 331 to 287.  
Stewart is the leading pitcher for Rock Island. Sid has won 9 and lost 5 games. Weiss boasts a higher percentage with 4 won and 1 lost. Dennis is only credited with 7 won, but this is an error. Denny had won 9 and lost 6 before the team left on the road trip.
