

**PORTAGE ROOMS FOR WOMEN**

Houses Filled With Max. Number—Officials Con- sider of Solution.

Urbana, Ill., July 16, 1920.—With all the cooperative and organized women, including both those operated by the university and those by the students, full, Ruby E. C. Mc- Donnell, dean of women of the University of Illinois, is finding it difficult to locate the many inquirers for rooms for the September term. The enrollment at the university this year is expected to be about nine thousand, many of the newcomers being young women.

Last year the same difficulty was encountered but the situation is even more serious this fall. Applications for rooms are coming in by the numbers each day and since all regulated houses are filled to the maximum number of women and many of the private homes have been accommodated as many as possible, but little relief seems in sight.

**University Rooms Taken.**  
All the places in the woman's residence hall, a dormitory operated by the university, were contracted for before the close of the regular school year in June. Rooms for about forty women in the Woman's League houses have also been taken. It is probable that more cooperative houses may be organized to meet the situation. However, those that are being planned have practically rented all their rooms for the fall term. Accommodations in the Y. W. C. A. and church houses, such as Presbyterian hall, Congre-

gational house and Ochsers hall, are all taken.  
**UNIVERSITY OFFICIALS** are confident that the situation will be met satisfactorily in the past.

**OQUAWKA**

Ray Turner, 31 years of age, a farm hand employed on the Frank Smith farm south of Rock Island, was found insane and sentenced to Watertown hospital at a hearing before Judge J. W. Gordon here Saturday. Two weeks ago Saturday Turner started to town accompanied by Clyde Chick, 13-year-old son of George Chick, a farmer of the Rock

Island vicinity. While in the buggy an automatic revolver, which Turner carried in his hip pocket, was accidentally discharged, the bullet lodging in young Chick's hip. The youth was taken to the Galena hospital and the bullet removed, and in a week's time was back home, apparently none the worse for the accident. Due to this incident it was found that Turner carried a revolver on all occasions, having the idea that because he was rejected from the army, being of short stature, the young men of his neighborhood thought him a slacker and that they intended to do him bodily injury. Turner claimed that several young men were after

him with guns, and that he had purchased the revolver for protection. The men named by Turner all testified Saturday that they had never thought of injuring Turner, and that the slacker idea had never entered their heads. Turner was arrested last week by a Rock Island officer, but gave him the slip, and Sheriff McDill was called Saturday to locate him. Sunday he was brought to the county jail here and held until his hearing Saturday. Sheriff McDill accompanied Turner to Watertown Monday. Turner seems to be sane on every subject except the one mentioned, is a man of good habits and a good worker.

**ADVISE SPRAYING OF FRUIT TREES; BOTH PREVENTION**

Fruit trees should be sprayed next week to control the second brood of codling moth. This warning has been issued to residents of the community from the office of Robert R. Warrenton, county farm adviser.

The trees should be sprayed with a mixture of four pounds of hydrated lime and one and a half pounds

of lead arsenate to 50 gallons of water, to prevent the second brood of the codling moth. The above compound was recommended in place of the lime sulphur for this month because, during the hot weather the lime sulphur is liable to burn the foliage. The compound
