

HALF DAY AND PAY ENDS FOR ARSENAL MEN

Saturday Afternoon Off During Winter to Be Deducted From Vacation Period.

The half holiday on Saturday for Rock Island arsenal workmen with pay ends with this Saturday, but as far as time off is concerned continues through the winter without remuneration, the time being deducted from the men's vacation period. The weekly half holiday feature with pay was made possible this summer through presidential proclamation, the period extending through Sept. 15.

Colonel Jordan, commandant, is awaiting receipt of the full copy of the findings of the war department in the cases of C. A. Cook and W. H. Aspengren. The war department has concurred in the dismissal of the two men, official notice of which has been received. The men were dismissed under the efficiency elimination system, but their activities in the arsenal federation were charged against them. The men appealed their cases to the war department.

Signor Tommaso Tittoni, who has been appointed one of Italy's representatives in the League of Nations council, is the president of the Italian senate and one of the best known of all Italian statesmen and diplomats. He was born at Rome in 1854 and has been in political life since he was 21 years old. Early in his career he was elected to the chamber of deputies, and in 1900 he was appointed prefect of the province of Naples. He has been twice minister for foreign affairs. He was ambassador in London from 1905 to 1906, and served in the same capacity in Paris during the early period of the World war. One of Signor Tittoni's greatest

achievements was the leading part he played in reestablishing the friendship between Italy and France.


