DECLARES ENGLISH AND FRENCH TEXTS OF PACT REVEAL DISCREPANCIES

ARTICLE 21 OF LEAGUE COVENANT. ENGLISH TEXT: "Nothing in this covenant shall be deemed to affect the validity of international agreements, such as treaties of arbitration or regional understandings like the Monroe doctrine, for securing the maintenance of peace." FRENCH TEXT: "Les engagements internationaux tels que les traites d'arbitrage et les ententes regionales, comme la doctrine de Monroe, qui assurent les maintiens de la paix, ne sont considérés comme incompatibles avec aucune des dispositions du present pacte."
