

### SPORTS SHOW ALL IN PRICE OF YEAR'S CROP

Charles C. Campbell Says Largest Crop of 1920 Exceeds Usual One of 1919.

According to the reports of Charles C. Campbell, county crop reporter, some very interesting comparisons can be made in the price of various grains and the average wage scale of the years of 1919 and 1920. The reports are for the months of November and December. Last year's corn crop was described as one of "unusual proportions," and this year's, which is almost completed, is one of the largest ever produced in the country. Price comparisons are as follows:

The average price of farm labor by the month when hired by the year is about the same, being 50¢ per month with board and \$70 without board. The average rate paid through the harvest time per day was about \$3.50 last year and \$3 this year with board, and \$4 both years without board. The average wages for work other than harvest was \$3 both years with board and \$4 last year and \$3.50 this year without board.
