Many trains due here have not arrived, and those which have are from tweive to sixteen hours late.

The Bliggard at St. Louis.

St. Louis, Feb. 13.-Snow began falling here and continued throughout the night until morning, when about ten inches of the "beautiful" had come down. Reports received show that the storm is general throughout Missouri and surrounding Railroad traffic is badly delayed, nearly all trains being from one to four hours inte. The local observer at the weather bureau issued a cold wave bulletin and predicts a fall of 30 degrees in the temperature. This will place the mercury 10 de grees below zero.

The Blizzard Reaches Ohio.

CLEVELAND, Feb. 12.-The blizzard which raged with such severity throughout the west has reach this city. A fierce gale accompanied by a heavy fall of fine, cutting snow is in progress, and the storm promises to be a most severe one. At noon the street car service was demoralized, only an occasional car managing to get through the heavy snew drifts. On the Lake Shore road trains were reported as more or less delayed from the west, with a prospect of serious blockades.

HAMMOND, Ind., Feb. 13.-A fierce snow


