Word was received from Washington this morning to the effect that the war department had approved the plans and specifications of the Davenport & Rock Island Railway company for the electric equipment of the bridge line, heretofore passed upon favorably by Col. Buffington, of Rock Island arsenal. The contracts, which have been pending awaiting the receipt of such information, will be let forthwith, and the road equipped as quickly as possible.

### A Baking Powder to Avoid.

The housekeeper will do well to keep her eye upon the schemes designed to force upon her fraudulent and dangerous baking powders. The latest is the canvaser for one of the inferior powders, who solicits orders for half pound boxes to be filled by the grocer to whom he turns them over at 25 cents each, of which 15 cents is to be paid in cash and the balance in a 10-cent rebate check which the solicitor leaves with the consumer. The object of the scheme is to make the housekeeper think she is getting 25 cents worth of baking powder for 15 cents.

The inferiority of such baking powder is clearly shown by the fact that the manufacturer can sell it for 20 cents a pound below the price of the standard brands. A baking powder that can be sold at these rates should be avoided, as the material alone required for a pound of pure and wholesome powder cost twice as much. A recent investigation by the government shows that a half pound of alum baking powder costs about one and a half cents. These are the powders that are sold by such schemes as those described. Alum baking powders are rank poison to many constitutions, but if people wish to buy them, they should not pay over 5 cents a pound for them, and then they would yield a profit of 100 per cent over cost to their manufacturers.

### Municipal Matters.

CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER, ROCK ISLAND, Feb. 12.—The council met in special session at 7:30 p. m., on call of the mayor, who stated the object to be to take up the revision of the city ordinances and such other business as may come before the council.

Mayor Medill presided and all the aldermen were present except Fickenscher.

On motion of Ald. Corken the clerk was instructed to return the deposited checks to the unsuccessful bidders on the scale house.

The clerk read an ordinance for the construction of a sewer beginning on Seventh avenue and running south on Twenty-first street beyond Ninth avenue by special assessment to the extent of the benefits. Adopted by unanimous vote, on motion of Ald. Dauber.

A recess of five minutes was taken to examine the estimates for the Twenty-first street sewer. On reassembling, Ald. Dauber submitted the report of the commissioners of the Twenty-first street sewer, which was adopted as read.

Ald. Dauber moved that the city attorney be instructed to commence proceedings accordingly in the circuit court. Adopted.

Ald. Corken moved that the city clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for constructing this sewer, each bid to be accompanied by a certified check for \$150. Adopted.

Ald. Dauber submitted a proposition of W. A. Darling to place sewers, pipes, etc., on the city map, at a charge of \$3 per day of eight hours, and moved that the proposition be adopted. Referred to the mayor and sewer committee with power to act, on motion of Ald. Bladel.

The council, on motion of Ald. Kinross, went into a committee of the whole on the revised ordinances, with Ald. Manker in the chair.

On rising at 10:30 o'clock, Ald. Manker, as chairman of the committee of the whole, reported progress, and asked time. Granted.

The mayor was, on motion, authorized to invite private bids for publishing the revised ordinances, and report to the next meeting of the council.

The council then adjourned on motion of Ald. Kuschmann.

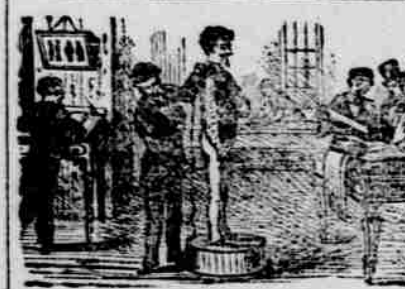
