In a Rock Island home whose surroundings have frequently been made the scenes of suspicion, a longsought-for offender is swiftly nearing the eternal sleep—the germs of the dread consumption having become firmly implanted. After years of disgrace and prosecution to his family, which in his absence was compelled to shoulder the burden of his wrong-doing, dedging the clutches of the authorities until physically broken down, he stealthily returns to die under the roof of his heart-broken mother's home. Although known but to a very few, he has been home for some time, immediately taking to confinement, from which it is believed he never can

The return of this man recalls numerous inexplicable crimes in which he was suspicioned of implication. and particularly does it renew the remembrances of the mysterious conflagration a few winters ago, when the contents of a store were destroyed and the stock robbed. The authorities suspicioned a certain ring of which the man was recognized as the leader. - He was shadowed, and when within the grasp of a policeman, who was prepared to place him under arrest, he made a desperate dash, and disappeared, and his whereabouts have since been unknown until now, when sickness drives him back.
