TOMORROW'S BIG PICNIC.
Second Annual of the Tenth District Woodmen Association.

The exercises at the Watch tower will begin at 1:30 p. m., and will consist of a foresters' prize drill, various sports, a bicycle road race, and addresses by G. H. McKown, president of the picnic association, Mayor William McConochie, Head Consul W. A. Northcutt, Head Clerk C. W. Hawes, Hon. J. G. Johnson, State's Attorney C. J. Searle and M. J. McEniry.

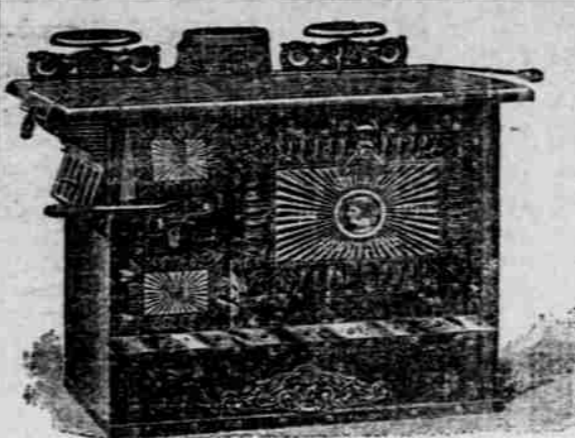

South on Twelfth street to Third avenue. East on Third avenue to Seventeenth street. South on Seventeenth street to Seventh avenue, where cars will be taken for the Watch Tower.

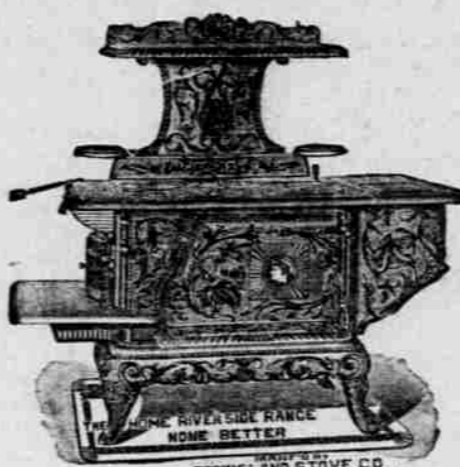

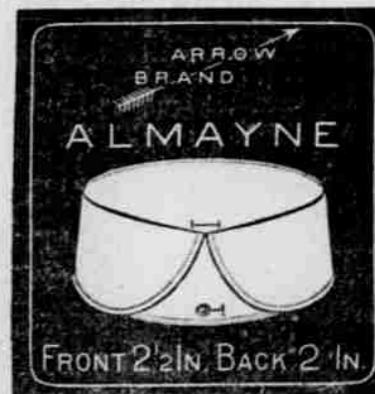
