Absconding Assistant Treasurer Arrested in Indian Territory.

SHERIFF AFTER HIM

Governor Issues Requisition Papers Today.

Albert E. Lyford, absconding deputy treasurer of Rock Island county, has been captured.

He is held a prisoner in Miami Nation, Indian Territory, and today Gov. Yates issued a requisition on the governor of the territory for his extradition.

During the week Sheriff W. G. Heider left the city, his assistants giving out the information that he had gone to New York City in connection with a case pending in the circuit court.

Instead, it is understood, he went to identify the man held in Miami Nation.

For weeks there has been correspondence between the authorities of Miami Nation and the Rock Island county sheriff, the latter demanding full description of the prisoner before he was satisfied to make the trip to identify him, as the letters from Indian Territory were not unlike the thousands he has been receiving since the disappearance of Lyford from all points of the globe.

Gets Away With \$11,000.

Lyford's pecuniations aggregated \$11,000, of which \$8,000 belonged to the county and \$3,000 to Treasurer L. F. Cox. Lyford disappeared Sept. 12. The county was reimbursed by the bondsmen of Treasurer Cox. It is said Lyford lost the money speculating on the Chicago board of trade.
