Relocation of Boilers at Lincoln School Recommended to Board.

DAILY PRACTICE OF FIRE DRILL

Among Pupils of Various Buildings in the City—Report on Attendance.

The monthly meeting of the board of education was held last evening. The committee on janitors and heating reported to the board that the heating plants of the Lincoln and high schools had been inspected and that they were in first class condition.

Superintendent Hayden's statistical report for the month ending Jan. 8, and comparative figures for the corresponding month last year, was as follows: Enrolled for the year, 3,594, increase of 24; enrolled for the month, 3,376, increase of 48; number belonging at the close of the month, 3,263, increase of 97; average number belonging, 3,271, increase of 54; average daily attendance, 3,139, increase of 54; percentage of attendance, 95.991, a slight increase; percentage of punctuality, 99.932, a slight decrease; number of cases of tardiness, 80, increase of 7; number of cases of truancy, 0, a decrease of 5.
