CITY IS FAVORED

Rock Island Has Lowest Mileage of Any Town in Three Eye Save Peoria.

TOTAL DISTANCE 2,403 MILES

Instructions to Umpires to Be Printed This Year—Islanders Show Up Well in Practice.

Rock Island's mileage under the schedule that has been approved for 1907 is 2,403 miles. That of the other towns in the Three-Eye is as follows: Peoria, 2,398; Cedar Rapids, 2,583; Dubuque, 2,931; Clinton, 2,655; Bloomington, 2,435; Springfield, 2,513; Decatur, 2,566.

The instruction to scorers throughout the league are soon to be sent out and now Secretary Miller of the league is working on the instructions to the umpires. These are to be arranged in a readable form and each of the indicator men will get a copy for reference. 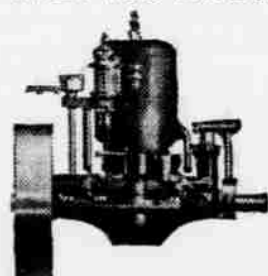

Welter Champion Outpointed by Mike, "Twin," Sullivan at Los Angeles.

GO 20 GRUELING ROUNDS

Honey's Rushes End in Clinches Where He is Severely Punished With Upper Cuts.

Los Angeles, Cal., April 24.—Mike (Twin) Sullivan was given the decision over Honey Melody at the end of twenty fast rounds last night. At all stages Sullivan showed unmistakable superiority and outgeneraled Melody at in-fighting. Melody's tactics were confined to rushes generally ending in clinches, where Sullivan used right upper cut and short-hand jabs to the face with telling effect.

Took Much Punishment. Melody took a world of punishment, and although at several stages of the fight he seemed staggered by stiff rights to the face, came back fighting.

FROM THE DOPE BOX.

McFarland, manager of the Clinton Infants, has released McGinty, the amateur catcher from this city. With him went Outfielder Kousche and Pitcher Stroud. The latter is expected to find a place in the Iowa league. McFarland is dickering with the Quincy team for exhibition games Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Both teams want to play at home.

The Three-Eye season opens one week from today. Until May 1 the farmers will have to depend on artificial irrigation.

Pa Hill has gone back into the game at Cedar Rapids and is covering the first sack. He has released Cooke, Gamble, and Greene. The first day that he was in the game the Rabbits beat Waterloo by a 5 to 0 score and the Cedar Rapids papers credit the victory to Hill's playing.

A clipping from one of the Mobile papers is to the effect that Mike Bryce is one of the fastest shortstops ever seen in that city, and that he is setting the Cotton States league alight with his fast work. In the first series he accepted fifteen chances without an error and his work of getting away from the plate is about as fast as seen in the big leagues. They call him "Rabbit" down there because of his fleetness, and say they wouldn't part with him for anything.

Manager Donnelly last evening released infielders Dillon and O'Brien. Dillon goes to Quincy of the Iowa state league and O'Brien will return to his home in Cleveland.

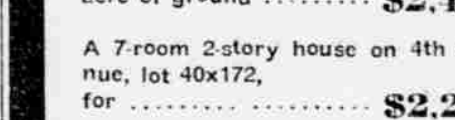
