

DISCHARGED MEN ARE REINSTATED

C. C. Wilson and A. W. Johnson, Arsenal Employees, Favored in Ruling.

ORDER FROM WASHINGTON

Chief of Ordnance Directs Return to Places Through the Acting Commandant.

Major Samuel Hof, acting commandant at Rock Island arsenal, has received from General Crozier, chief of ordnance, an order directing the reinstatement of C. C. Wilson and A. W. Johnson, of this city, both of whom were dismissed as employees in the government shops for their having participated as candidates in the April commission primary here. Mr. Wilson and Mr. Johnson have been advised of the ruling by the chief of ordnance and informed that they may return to their old places in the machine shop at the arsenal. Mr. Wilson, in the interim, has been appointed superintendent of waterworks in this city, and of course will not return to the government service.

CARRY CASE UP.
Mr. Wilson and Mr. Johnson insisted that an injustice had been done them at the arsenal, and their case was carried before the civil service commission at Washington, where a committee from the arsenal presented the facts during the time that the protest was being waged at the national capital against the introduction of the Taylor system of management in the shops of the local arsenal. It was shown that neither of the men campaigned for the nomination, but that their petitions were circulated by their friends among the employees in the arsenal shops. It was charged that the real reason for the dismissal of the two men was due to their activity in opposing the enforcement of the Taylor shop plan in the arsenal shops. The cause assigned for their discharge was an alleged violation of the civil service regulations prohibiting employees seeking elective public office.

COMMITTEE TO REPORT.
A public mass meeting of arsenal workers is to be held at Turner Grand opera house, Duquoin, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. At that time the committee that visited Washington will make a report.
