DRESDEN CHINA. Its Three Periods and the Marks the Pieces Bear.

Dresden china began its reign at the fair of Leipzig. 1721, where it was offered for public sale for the first time. It has had three periods-King's, Marcoline and modern. The factory marks traced on the bot

tom of each piece vary according to the period-the oldest (King's) being the monogram A. R. and the wand of Aesculapius. The familiar crossed swords, with the dot or circle between the handles, were first used in 1721, and the star took the place of the dot in the Marcoline period. The modern mark is the simple crossed swords, sometimes accompanied by letters and numbers.

Although the methods of work are still jealously guarded in all fuctories, the essentials are an open secret, and the following rough outline may satisfy the lazily curious: The ingredients of porcelain are knolln feldspar, sand and selenite. These are ground fine and mixed in timewater. The paste is then molded into forms and fired in an oven of moderate heat. When taken out it is in an opaque state and is then dipped in the glaze, which is feldspar ground fine, with a little alkali. It is now subjected to a firing of great heat, which results in the beautiful polished surface so familiar the world

This second firing is attended with risk, for if the piece is allowed to remain beyond the exact proper moment the whole melts together and is ruined.
