Marine Greeting. The salutation given when a vessel lowers or "dips" its flag is one of the oldest and most honorable of all forms of marine greeting.

This form of salute has always been demanded by English speaking scamen, and its exaction has burned the hearts and the powder of generations of naval commanders. In the old days for a foreign ship, whether merchant or naval, to enter
