Practical Ultimatum Demanding Reply by Midnight.

VOTE FOR BIG WAR FUND

Opposition to War Measures in Commons Disappears-Crowds Cheer.

London, Aug. 4 .- Great Britain has sent a practical ultimatum to Germany demanding a satisfactory reply by midnight tonight on the subject of Belgian neutrality.

The proclamation of King George commanding the mobilization of the British army was read today from the steps of the royal exchange. A huge crowd cheered and sang the national anthem.
