Olsen, \$25, for services rendered during high water at the city's bridges was referred to the bridge committee and Bridge-tender Sweeney to report.

On motion of Ald. Bladel the rules were suspended. Ald. Schroeder presented a petition of the Tri-City Electric Sprinkler Co. for the permission to locate manholes between street car tracks on the corner of Second avenue and Fifteenth street and also on Third avenue and Twentieth street for water supply for their proposed sprinklers and praying for immediate action. Ald. Schroeder moved that the prayers of the petition be granted subject to the investigation and approved of by the committee and superintendent of waterworks. Motion adopted.

Ald. Bladel offered the following and moved its adoption. Resolved, That the mayor and city clerk be and hereby instructed to enter into contract with the Edwards & Walsh Construction Co., for the improvement of certain strips of ground on Fourth avenue occupied by the Davenport & Rock Island Street Railway Co." Adopted.

On motion of Ald. Bladel the council adjourned to Monday evening next.
