Washington.-The report from the bureau of corporations on the United States Steel corporation recently submilted to President Taft, has been made public.
Signed by Herbert, Knox Smith, commissioner of corporations, the report makes no recommendations and Mr. of competition was a prime object of of competion wa the Steel cornora. he organizers of the Steel corporation, or so-called "trust." Capitalized at $\$ 1,404,000,000$, the

of the "water" in the company has been eliminated.

"Indeed, insofar as the Steel corpor ation's position in the entire fron and steel industries is of monopolistic character, it is chiefly through its control of ore holdings and the transportation of ore."
Discussing how "the impending struggle of the giants" was averted, almost over night, by the formation of the great combination, taking in 250 subsidiary companied controlling 60 per cent of the total erude and finished steel production of the country the report says:
"Until 1898 the bulk of the busiress was distributed among a very considerable number of concerns. There was sharp competition modifled by frequent pools of greater or less duraon and effectiveness.
Then came an era of great combina tans, the report continues, with cap
talizations ranging from $\$ 30,000,000$ to $\$ 100,000,000$, mergers of many smaller companies, which instead of eliminat ing competition threatened to begin price cutting on a larger scale than price cutting on a larger scale than
ever before. companies-the Carnegie company Federal Steel and Natlonal Steeldominating the production of crude and semi-finished products, and six concerns-the American Steel and Wire, American Tin Plate, American Steel Hoop, American Sheet Steel, Na tional Tube and American Bridgecontrolling the lighter finished prod ucts.
