Patrolman Howard Austin, of 7162 Wanda, was promoted to Detective and he will be awarded the Wesson Seyburn Distinguished Service Cross "for his work in eliminating a particularly menacing group engaged in illicit narcotic traffic."

Patrolman Billy Jaques, of 7335 Winston, will be awarded the Detroit Police Department Distinguished Medal of Valor for "the unflinching courage displayed by Patrolman Jaques in standing his ground in the face of a murderous shotgun fire and his calm determined action in returning the fire brought about the subsequent surrender of the (an armed irate husband) and is in keeping with the highest traditions of law enforcement."

Patrolman Donald Peek of the 13th Precinct will be awarded the Detroit News Medal for Valor, for the reasons that:

The courageous action of Patrolman Peek in withholding his fire though his own life was in jeopardy is in keeping with the highest traditions of law enforcement and resulted in the uncovering of a vicious bandit gang and the solution of many felonies.

Patrolman Peek resides at 9040 N. Clarendon.

Patrolman Robert Leskie of the 10th Precinct will be awarded the Walter Scott Distinguished Service Medal for:

recovering a bag containing stolen money, a gun and clothing used in holdups — the courageous determination displayed by Patrolman Leskie, and his cool, resourceful action in withholding his fire although in great personal danger, resulted in the capture of a dangerous suspect, the solution of several felonies, and exemplifies the finest traditions of law enforcement.

"One of the Constitutional amendments under consideration would go so far as to forbid judicial interference with any law affecting public schools — thus wiping out the historic decision of the U. S. Supreme Court in 1954 barring public school segregation."

"The American Jewish Congress is vigorously opposed to any amendment to the Bill of Rights. We believe, as well, that the American people are equally opposed to any effort to abridge our Constitutional guarantees of freedom, equality and justice."

"We therefore urge every citizen to write to his Senators to express this single — but vital — thought:

"Hands off the Bill of Rights!"

COURT NEWS — by Court Reporter

3 Men Get Life Terms For Oct. 4, '60 Murder

Three men who were convicted of first degree murder by a jury in the Oct. 4, 1960, slaying of David Lipton in his drug store at 9368 Kercheval, were sentenced to life in Jackson Prison last week by Recorder's Judge Frank G. Schemanski.

They are Gene Adams, 22, of 526 Polk, River Rouge; Ronald Gilliam, 24, of 298 Frazier, River Rouge; and Kenneth Anderson, 29, now serving a sentence for armed robbery in Jackson Prison.

Police said the alleged triggerman, Joseph Kelly, 27, who fired five shots into Lipton's body is still at large, and being sought. He was released from Jackson Prison through a "clerical error," and fled.

The fourth man in the holdup-slaying will be sentenced Aug. 9.

Louis Buckley, 40, of 3227 East Congress, was sentenced to 10 to 20 years in Jackson Prison last week by Recorder's Judge W. McKay Skillman, after he was convicted of second degree murder by a jury.

Buckley is charged with the last March 9 fatal stabbing of Nathaniel Ware, 26, of 727 Green. Ware was dead on admittance to Receiving Hospital from 722 Lieb, where both men had been attending a party.

Homicide detectives said Ware had been playing the piano and stopped. He was asked by Buckley to play another number, and an argument ensued between the two men when Ware refused saying, "I am tired of playing," at which time Buckley inflicted the fatal stab wounds.

Francis Woods, 36, of 100 Clairmont, was placed on one year's probation last week by Recorder's Judge John A. Ricca after pleading guilty to acting as a practical nurse without a license.

Henry Earl Jones, 48, of 7423 Prairie, was placed on two years' probation and assessed to pay \$100 costs within a month last week by Recorder's Judge Gerald W. Groat after he was convicted by a jury of making a false felony report.

Jones reported that Sgt. Riley of the McGraw Station stole \$300 in cash from a dresser drawer in his home last March 24.

Billie Merriweather, 20, of 2913 St. Antoine, was charged with larceny last week in a warrant signed by Recorder's Judge Joseph A. Gillis.

Merriweather was arrested in a downtown department store after he walked to the cash register, punched a key and removed \$26 in bills from the drawer of the register.

A store detective saw the youth and attempted to ask him about taking the money from the register. A scuffle ensued which developed into a fight, and the money was scattered over the floor among shoppers.

Police arrived, place Merriweather under arrest and confiscated the stolen money.

The officers quoted Merriweather saying: "It is foolish to do this — because I am already on parole."

Police said Merriweather admitted stealing a ring he had in his possession from another store.

Willis Sparks, 45, of 5462 Four-

teenth, was charged with arson last week in a warrant signed by Recorder's Judge Joseph A. Gillis. Sparks was arrested on the complaint of his alleged girlfriend, Inez Broadnax, 44, of 5146 Brooklyn, who accused Sparks of setting fire to her home in two places, after she refused to admit him.

Sparks denied the charges. He admitted calling at the home of Miss Broadnax: "I just wanted to tell her the good news. That I might get called back to work, and would have some money to give her. But she closed the door and told me to 'Go away.'"

Veal Hall, 32, of 1197 Concord, was sentenced to 3 to 5 years in Jackson Prison last week by Recorder's Judge John A. Ricca.

Hall was convicted of breaking and entering the office of a garage at 12105 Hooper, last June 10.

Police said desks in the office was ransacked and a store a pair of silver cuff links and a roll of U.S. postage stamps.

The officers said Hall admitted the theft. They quoted him saying: "I was driving around in my car when I decided to break into the place and look for money."

Malcolm William Murphy, 18, of 476 St. Clair, was charged with breaking and entering a church last week in a warrant signed by Recorder's Judge Joseph A. Gillis.

Police said the youth admitted removing a second floor bathroom window, getting into the church and using his 16-year-old girlfriend into the building.

The youngsters were caught in the church by the pastor, the Rev. Harry Chapman, of 4537 French Road.

Witchia Jones, 39, of 2615 Pennsylvania, was found guilty of nonsupport last week by Recorder's Judge Gerald W. Groat and placed on two years' probation for family support.
