C. Owens and wife of Seligman, are visiting in the city from the Arizona town.

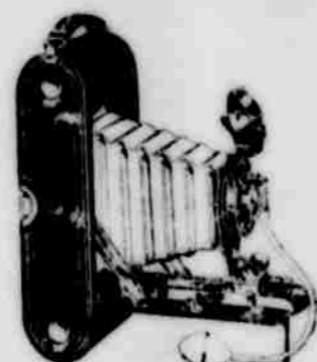

VAIO IS FINED TEN FOR STRIKING FIRE CHIEF

Trouble Between Klein and First Street Merchant Aired Today; Defendant Gives Notice of Appeal.

A spirited debate was carried on in police court this morning between Joe Vaio and Fire Chief J. Klein, when Vaio answered to the charge of assault brought against him as a result of a scuffle engaged in by the two men Monday night.

In attempting to ascertain the location of a fire which was apparently in Vaio's store on North First street, the fire chief ran foul of the merchant and a fierce combat raged in the half light cast by flickering gleams from a pile of coals in the carriage yard next door.

While the trusty fire ladders were engaged in turning chemicals on the eumbers, their chief lay in the grip of his stoutest opponent, both colling about the lot. To terminate the combat, Klein testified this morning that he asserted his authority as fire chief on active duty, and placed Vaio under arrest.

"I didn't know Klein could speak me," said Vaio to the court this morning. "But when he did arrest me, I asked him to give me time to put on my shoes. Then I followed him."

It developed, however, that two policemen appeared on the scene at the junction of the proceedings, and Vaio's word was accepted that he would appear in police court in the morning. The trouble happened after midnight Monday.

Vaio was represented in court today by Attorney J. C. Espinosa, whose eloquent pleading did not save his client a fine of ten dollars.

According to Vaio, the case will be appealed to the district court.
