Mayor Sellers has accepted an appointment on the legislative committee of the National Old Trails Road association, proffered in the following letter:

Kansas City, Mo., May 14, 1912. Hon. U. S. Hall, Glasgow, Missouri. Dear Hall:

Our constitution strangely omits power to appoint a committee on legislation, but this is so important that I am going to assume the authority and risk its ratification by the next stockholders' convention.

The "Shackelford Amendment" now pending in the senate is a long step in the direction of national aid, but should be looked after. Of course, we are not prepared to pay its expense and could not under our constitution even if we had the money, but I have no doubt the next convention will authorize reimbursement whenever we have the funds.

Mr. Lincoln Hancock of Greenup, Illinois, has volunteered his services in this regard, and it may be well to

cooperate with him, and to get in touch with all similar organizations. I have therefore appointed yourself as chairman. L. H. Bassell of Effingham, Ill.; Jesse Taylor of Jamestown, Ohio; E. W. Black of Council Grove, Kansas; and D. K. Sellers of Albuquerque, New Mexico, to act as a committee on legislation.

This is highly important and I hope you can see your way clear to devote some time and effort to this great work.
