**SPORTS****RIVERS PROBABLE OPPONENT FOR CHAMPION**

By Knocking Out "Kaye" Brown, Mexican Lightweight Demonstrates Superiority in the 133 Pound Division.

**Joe Rivers, sensational Mexican Lightweight, who decisively defeated "Knockout" Brown of New York in ten rounds recently in Vernon, Cal., will be the opponent of Johnny Dundee, the great little New Yorker, in a ten round contest in Manhattan Casino in New York Friday night. Dundee has now locked upon as one of the most dangerous rivals now confronting Johnny Kilbane, the 122 pound champion. White and Dundee have agreed to weigh in at 128 pounds ringside, that being the best figure that White can make at this time.**

White already has handed Dundee a good trouncing, but the eastern boy has improved greatly since that time and it is his firm opinion now that he will reverse the tables in his coming meeting with the Windy city rascal.

Dundee, however, is a serious obstacle in the way of the title holder. On September 1, last, Dundee and Kilbane hooked up in a ten-round non-decision match in New York City and the majority of the newspapers gave the bout to Dundee. Kilbane has claimed that the native son spirit influenced the scales of the metropolis, but even if this is true or not it must be admitted by even the champion himself that Dundee gave him a mighty hard argument. Since that time there has been frequent talk of a re-match but not until lately did anything definite in this respect develop. It is understood now that Dundee and Kilbane have agreed to meet in a twenty-round contest on the Pacific coast at a date to be selected later.

Conley was regarded as the toughest featherweight in the ranks. When he was matched with Dundee it was believed the latter was doomed to defeat, but he surprised the Kenosha fighter's friends by displaying more skill and greater punching power than any man of his weight had shown in California for some time.

Kilbane's title of champion is in danger with Dundee in the running. The New Yorker is said to be featherweight pure and simple, and can easily make 122 pounds. If he possesses the cleverness he is credited with and can hit his bright prospects of making a mark for himself in this division.
