The physicians are Dr. L. Blumwanger and Dr. Hermann Baumgartner, and the other witness is Meta Wessel. They all live at Kreuzlingen, Canton Thurgau, but their depositions will be taken at St. Gall May 18. Judge Stark died in Switzerland.

SMALLPOX EPIDEMIC IN VALENCIA VILLAGES

Indian Agent Lonergan Advised
by Doctor Dillon that
Outbreak in Four Villages
Is Serious.

Indian Agent P. T. Lonergan of Albu-

querque was advised by a letter from Dr. Dillon, the agency physician,

this morning of a serious outbreak of

smallpox in the villages in and

around Culero, Valencia county.

The spread of the disease has been

so rapid as to be in the nature of an

epidemic and while Dr. Dillon says

many of the cases are mild, others

are of the most virulent type and he

expresses considerable uneasiness as

to existing quarantine regulations

and whether or not they will serve to

prevent further spread. The villages

affected are Culero, San Jose, La

Vista and a small settlement near

Encinal. All are native settlements.
