AUSTRALIAN LOAN IS
OVERSUBSCRIBED

Melbourne, Australia, Sept. 11.—Much to the gratification of the Australian government the first issue of the commonwealth loan of £10,000,000, consisting of £2,500,000, applications for which expired upon August 31, was largely oversubscribed. Upon September 3, in the house of representatives, amid cheers from the members, the prime minister, Andrew Fisher, read a letter from the governor of the Commonwealth bank in which the latter announced that the number of applications received for the issue was nearly 17,000 and the total amount applied for was just short of \$45,000,000.

ANSWERS ARTICLE
IN BELEN NEWS

Albuquerque, N. M. To the Editor of the Belen News, Belen, N. M. Dear Sir: Your caustic and uncalled-for editorial note regarding an accident to an automobile near Socorro ordinarily would be permitted to go unnoticed. We are unable to determine at this distance just why the lack of a log of the road should have caused the driver of the car to lose control of his machine on any sort of a road. We are also unable to determine just why this attack should be made in the manner it was, for the reason that the Butler Auto company has no office in Belen, because the seventeen miles of road from the Belen bridge to Becker Station is next to impassable on account of sand. Also this road is eleven miles longer than the mesa road over which our log trucks all tourists. When the sand is eliminated we prefer to send the tourist down the mesa road, which he may see and appreciate that New Mexico is something besides desert. One car backing this stretch of sand will cause dozens of other tourists to select some other route, thus depriving New Mexico of the much desired traffic. This writer does not believe the people of Belen as a body prefer to see a few automobiles this year and none hereafter, but rather that they are far sighted enough to realize that there will be hundreds of cars traveling the mesa to Orosi on highway in the future, provided through travel, now make good reports on the road conditions.

GERMAN FARMERS
WILL CONTINUE
FEEDING NATION

Berlin, Oct. 23.—German farmers will continue to feed the country without the aid of overseas imports, in the opinion of Prof. Gerlach, an authority in agricultural chemistry. Speaking before the German Agricultural society at its yearly meeting at Berlin he gave details showing to what extent in 1914 and 1915 the yield of crops was increased by using sulphate of ammonia and cyanamide, a combination of atmospheric nitrogen with calcium, as fertilizer. In these fertilizers, he says, German farmers have a fully satisfactory substitute for the nitrate of soda which they had been importing to the amount of about 800,000 tons a year.

Prof. Gerlach regards the new industry of extracting nitrogen from the atmosphere as of great promise for the future of the German food supply. He said that the factories for its recovery, mostly begun since the outbreak of the war, are now finished or nearing completion, and that when they are all in operation they will produce yearly an equivalent of 120,000 tons of pure nitrogen or already considerably more than half of what was formerly imported. A considerable proportion of this is now being used by the military authorities for making ammunition but will, after the war, be available for fertilizing purposes.

Pending the increase of the output of all kinds of crops can be furnished with phosphate, Prof. Gerlach adds that it is best used mainly for increasing the grain yield, potatoes—the largest crop by far produced in Germany—can do very well without a fertilizer, as is proved by the splendid crop of this year.

TAKE STEPS FOR
PRESERVING THE
ENGLISH PEERAGE

London, Oct. 19.—Means are to be adopted to prevent passages from being adopted in cases where the only male heir has given his title to his country. In the ordinary course, succession to a peerage is limited to direct male descendants of the peer, or of a former holder of the peerage, unless being excluded. But by "substantive remainder," as the provision is called, the female line is given his title to his country. There are now at least 500 ladies in peerages in the British and Irish peerages and a number have already fallen. Among the dead are Lord Walsingham, Viscount Blyth, who was the only son and heir of Lord Stanbury, the Earl's private secretary, and the Viscountess Mervyn-Thompson, the wife of Lord Kinnear, Lord Kinnear's only son in action but he has grandchildren by his daughters.

Titles are allowed to descend by the female line by special remainder in a number of existing peerages, notably in the case of Lord Haldesley, whose only male heir was killed in the World War. Of course, there are no lack of direct male heirs of former titles and in one of the former peerages, but the recently bestowed titles lack this advantage.

Lord Kinnear's heir is a special remainder, his elder brother, Viscount Kinnear, Lord Stanbury's title passed to his daughter, the Viscountess Stanbury.

AMERICAN MOTOR
EXPORT TRADE
DOUBLES

Indications Now Are That at Present Rate 1915-1916 Foreign Automobile Sales Will Reach \$120,000,000.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 23.—American automobile manufacturers doubled their sales abroad last year, their exports of automobiles and parts thereof in the year ending June 30, 1915, having aggregated over \$24,000,000 compared with \$12,000,000 in 1914, the first year of record.

The gains were most pronounced in the second half of the fiscal year and of the record made by only being exceeded during the end of December, when some 100,000 cars were shipped to the foreign markets.

All kinds of automobiles and passenger cars were exported, but the most popular being the touring car, the sedan and the light car.

CHINA WILL SUPPLY
BEEF TO PHILIPPINES
AFTER THIS YEAR

(Associated Press Correspondence) Peking, Sept. 21.—China will probably supply the American troops in the Philippines with fresh beef this year, Major Hugh Matthews of the United States army and several other officers have recently made visits to different parts of China for the purpose of inspecting beef animals and determining whether Chinese beef is suitable for the American army, which is very particular about the quality of meat supplied to its troops.

Contractors in China have signified a willingness to compete for the army contract in the Philippines. As the Americans who have been supplying beef to the United States troops will not be able to supply beef this year for the reasons because of the large exportation of beef to the United States, it is likely that China will take the beef contract in Manila.
