Local War Committee Is Ready to Conduct Labor Clearing House

The committee on preparedness and public safety has started a labor clearing house for the country in the office of County Agent H. C. Stewart, in the Commercial club building. Ranchers in need of help have been listed and men and women looking for ranch work may obtain places by registering their names with the committee's secretary.

Workers seeking places are asked to register from everywhere in the country. It is expected that when the bureau is in full operation districts in need of labor will be able to draw readily on districts where there is a surplus of help.

Later in the season it is probable that there will be a statewide—perhaps a nationwide—organization for the movement of farm and ranch laborers from districts where there is an over-abundance of labor to districts in need of workers.

KNIFE ON CORNS CAUSES LOCKJAW

Tells How to Loosen a Tender Corn So It Lays Out With-out Pain.

You reckless men and women who are pestered with corns and who have at least once a week invited an awful death from lockjaw or blood poison are now told by a Cincinnati authority to use a drug called frezone, which the moment a few drops are applied to any corn, the soreness is relieved and soon the entire corn, root and all, lifts out with the fingers.

It is claimed that a quarter of an ounce will cost very little at any of the drug stores, but is sufficient to rid one's feet of every hard or soft corn or callus.
