It Was a Close Call, but he Finally Objected to being Laid Out.

(Charlotte News)

The neighbors of Mr. Elias Garrison, in Berryhill township, this county, assembled at his house last Monday to lay him out, as he had been pronounced a corpse and had every appearance of being a genuine one. Just as they were getting ready to set to work, however, Mr. Garrison came to life and put a stop to the proceedings. It came about by a fall from a tree. A swarm of bees had settled on a limb of a tree in Mr. Garrison's yard. Mr. Garrison is a cepole, but he has a tooth for honey and decided to have the swarm. He climbed up the tree and began sawing off the limb upon which the bees had settled. He worked the saw with his right hand while he held on to another limb with his left hand for support and leverage. He had scarcely commenced operations before this supporting limb gave way and he was precipitated to the ground, 30 feet below. He was picked up for dead. It being considered so soonly sure that his neck was broken, but, as already related, he came to before the neighbors had got the grave clothes on him. Mr. Garrison was seriously hurt, but Dr. Herron says that he will recover.

LATE NEWS ITEMS.

At the election recently held in Jackson township, Northampton county, upon the question of subscribing \$15,000 to the railroad from Garysburg to Tunis the proposition was carried by practically a unanimous vote, only seventeen votes being cast against it. The county is to issue bonds to the amount of \$15,000, which are to bear 6 per cent interest and are to run twenty years. A similar election will be held in another township on the first Saturday in June where there is considerably more opposition to the measure.
