A Passenger Train Runs Into a Freight, Killing Three and Injuring Many.

ELEVEN ITALIANS SERI-OUSLY WOUNDED.

h Was a Horrible Scene and the Shrieks and Cries of the Wounded Were Unbearable.

SYRACUSE, N. Y., Aug. 6 .- The St. Louis Express on the West Shore Railroad which leaves here at 1:58 a. m., met with a terrible accident three miles west of Port Byron this morning near what is known as the Dutches Cut.

The train was running at a high rate of speed and at that point ran into a freight train. The wreck was an awful one and 3 persons were killed outright and those died from their injuries were all Italians but one, the fireman of the passenger train. Eleven Italians were badly hurt and four will probably die. 12 cars of the freight train were wrecked and piled upon the tracks, completely blocking the


