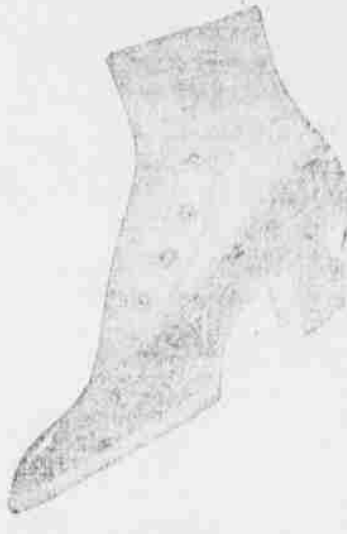
The public schools in Cairo will have their Christmas exercises and Friday afternoon and the program will be given from 10 o'clock to 2 o'clock on that day.
