

### THE POSTAL COMPLAINS IN U. S. CIRCUIT COURT

Western Union Makes Unfair Charges on Joint Messages Sent by People.

New York, Oct. 5.—The Postal Telegraph Co. has made complaint in the Public Service Commission of a second district of the charges exacted by the Western Union for business originating on Postal lines has been for order restraining the Western Union Telegraph Co. from discriminating against competitors in a matter of rate. This action of the Postal Co. in this state is in line with similar aggressive moves made by this and other subsidiaries of the Puckey Companies. Last June a suit was started in New Mexico charging conspiracy between the Pioneers of the Western Union, the way laid for action under the anti-trust laws in several states of the south, the complaint laid before the public service commission alleges that the Postal has no office and is obliged to send its messages over the Western Union wires for delivery; the late company makes excessive charges; the practice is for the Eastern Union to receive a message for delivery in a town where the Western Union has only office to collect from the sender of the message the same is then charged by the Western Union between the sending point and destination; it transmits over its lines to the nearest point possible and then turns it over to the Western Union; the complaint alleges not only charges to destination, but adds a charge of four or five extra words indicating that the message has been turned over to the Western Union for transmission; these additional words give the place where the message was turned over; the date; in addition to the full local rate the Western Union makes a charge of from two to three cents a word for these in excess of ten; the Postal Co. claims that it is obligated to pay as a result of such discrimination a greater sum than it receives from the sender of the message. It is further alleged that the Western Union does not charge the same companies sending messages from New York over its land lines for additional words, indicating that these messages have been turned over for transmission. The commission is asked to make order permanently restraining the Western Union from charging for additional words as complained of by the Postal Telegraph Cable Co.; that the practice is continued it will be necessary for it to refuse to accept a large proportion of such messages from the public.

The election of directors for the ensuing year resulted as follows: Edwin Gould, R. Gallaway, Howard Gould, Winslow Pierce, Wm. H. Taylor, E. T. Jeffers of New York; P. H. Britton, Murdock Carleton, Tom Randolph, of St. Louis. The directors elected the following officers: Edwin Gould, president; F. Britton, vice president and general manager; Wm. H. Taylor, vice president; D. H. Morris, vice president, succeeding N. A. Campbell; A. Trussell, secretary; H. L. Usher, assistant secretary; G. K. Warner, treasurer and assistant secretary. All other officers are appointive and will be no changes. The stockholders formally ratified the action of the directors in regard to the lease of the Central Arkansas Eastern railroad and the purchase of the Stephenville North and Texas Railroad. Particulars are fully given in the annual report which included reference to the St. Louis freight terminal and the property interest of the Cotton Belt. The St. Louis Terminal Association, was approved by the stockholders.

### AFTER BUTTERINE CO.

Prosecution of One Plant in Chicago Indicted for Perjury as Result of Sims' Inquiry.

Chicago, Oct. 5.—Frank H. Harding, cashier and chief clerk for the William J. Morey Company, Incorporated, manufacturer of butterine, was indicted on a charge of perjury by the federal grand jury today, said to have been committed while being examined with regard to the business methods of the butterine company. Harding furnished \$5,000 bond for his appearance tomorrow. District Attorney Sims has been conducting an investigation of the alleged illegal coloring of butter for many weeks. The investigation started upon the allegations that the national government has been cheated out of large sums in taxes by the fraudulent use of the government label.

### HOKE SMITH ELECTED GOVERNOR OF GEORGIA.

Atlanta, Oct. 5.—Hoke Smith was today elected to serve a second term as governor of Georgia. Incomplete returns indicate that Governor Joseph M. Brown, Independent Democrat, who defeated Smith two years ago, did not receive a majority of votes in any one of the counties (114). All regular Democratic nominees of the state and county officers were also elected.
