MORMONISM'S HISTORIAN.

Andrew Jensen and His Revelations Concerning Latter Day Saints. One of the most interesting witnesses in the senate hearing of the Reed Smoot case was Andrew Jensen, assistant historian of the Mormon church.

In the course of his testimony Jensen said there are fifty-three stakes and 700 wards in Zion, a president being at the head of each stake and a bishop of the wards. A stake is about the size of a county usually, but with the increase of the population it has been necessary to make as many as three stakes in some of the counties.



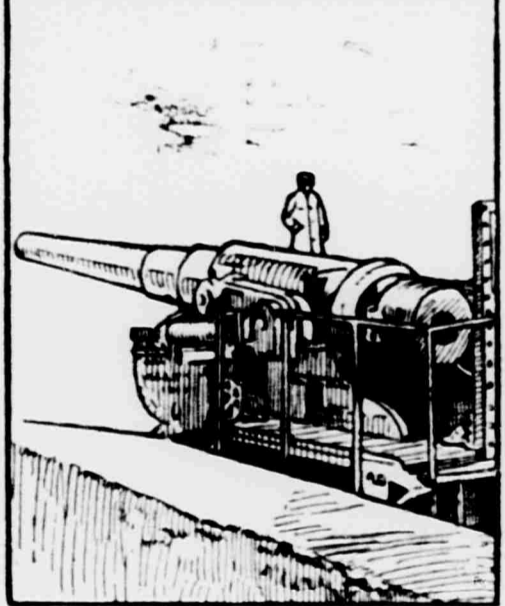

ANDREW JENSEN and he selects one. There are other officers, called teachers, who are selected by the bishops.

Jensen described the duties of teachers, who are required to instruct and reprove members who violate the rules of the church. No officer, even the president of the church, is above the bishop and teachers of his ward in matters concerning moral conduct in the ward.

In answer to questions Mr. Jensen said that he had never known of a prosecution of a polygamist who continued to live with plural wives he had married prior to the manifesto of 1890 and said that if any Mormon should inform against a polygamist under such conditions—against President Smith, for instance—such informer would be odious to most members of the church.

"THE TIGER'S TAIL." The harbor of Port Arthur, the Russian stronghold considered impregnable until captured by the Japs from the Chinese ten years ago, is formed by an oval inlet of the sea about two miles long from east to west and one mile from north to south. It is surrounded by high hills, and its only entrance is by a narrow channel on the southern side. A slender spit of land, known as "the Tiger's Tail," which runs diagonally across its northern extremity, acts as a breakwater and protects the harbor from storms.

The high hills on each side of the entrance are lined with forts, the highest being that on Golden hill, on the eastern shore. This fort is 410 feet above sea level and completely commands the channel. On the hills west of the channel are other strong forts, while along the shore is a string of smaller fortifications reaching up to "the Tiger's Tail." Near the tip of the tail is a huge fortification, the guns of which have a straight sweep down the channel to the entrance of the harbor.
