FRATERNITIES, SCHOOLS,
AID BUILDING MOVEMENT.

Washington, Aug. 18.—(Capital News Service).—The slow but sure economic recovery throughout the country continues to be reflected in reports of healthier building conditions in which, as has been before pointed out by the Capital News Service, the fraternal bodies, and those at the head of churches and schools, are taking an active part. In Louisville just now about twenty sites are being offered and examined in connection with the plan of the Masons of Kentucky to build a new, substantial and comfortable widow's and orphan's home. The home will cost \$1,000,000.

At the Grand Lodge meeting of Kentucky Masons in October, final plans for the structure will be worked out, and the new site will not be selected until after that time. The greater part of the fund for building has been raised.

Paralleling the movement inaugurated by the Women's Roosevelt Memorial Association to restore Theodore Roosevelt's birthplace in New York city, is that of the Woman's Foundation of Washington City to raise funds for the building in that city of a replica of Bullock Hall at Roswell, Ga., birthplace of Roosevelt's mother. Both of these movements are progressing steadily toward the goals.

Masons of Boston have just closed a deal for the purchase for \$120,000 of what is known as the Slater home in that city, at Beacon and Harvard streets, Boston, for use as a Masonic Club.

Students, past present and future of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, will be interested in the acquisition of "The

Beeches," a famous and attractive property in a wooded suburban section of the Kentucky metropolis, where will be erected a new seminary. The cost of the later will approximate \$2,000,000.
