Hold Your Broom Corn

EDITOR BEAVER HERALD:—I am from Kentucky, and know something of the Tobacco Buyers' Association. Here I find you have organized the Broomcorn Buyers and Manufacturers Association. If you permit (which I hope you will not) them to dictate all terms you will find in the course of a very few years that you will have no stay in it. Except you hire expert broom-makers and export your own manufacturing, which will not pay. Do you of Western Oklahoma realize that broom-corn, and in fact all crops, were injured by the drought?

It is to your benefit, but sad to relate, not enough broom-corn in New York to supply New York alone. Eastern Oklahoma and most of Texas broom-corn is a failure. With this fact in view, that a strip of territory 150 by 200 miles through Western Oklahoma and Texas has raised nearly two-thirds of all the broom-corn raised in the United States this year. I ask you why? Are you in a hurry to seed and sell? I am not 60 years old, but I have seen broom-corn sell for \$500 per ton; and it would not surprise me if in the near future it sold for that again.

When were wages as high as now? Boys getting \$2.00 to \$2.50 per day. Women who were willing to work for \$1.00 per day when broom-corn sold for \$500 per ton, now receive \$2.00 to \$2.50 day. So do not be in a hurry to sell. But some one will say, "I am under mortgage to my banker, and he wants his money." Your first obligation is to your wife and child. You sell now for \$100, pay off your note, let the family suffer the pangs of hunger and cold, while if you wait with the rest of us and tell the banker to wait, you would get \$200, and be able to pay the banker and some interest, and have a nice sum left to squander on the ones you profess to love dearer than life itself. I am from Missouri; show me.
