

School Lands Earn \$300,000

S. W. Stone, secretary to the commissioners of the land office, has turned over to Robert Dunlop, state treasurer, about \$300,000, representing the earnings and income of the school lands and farm loan interest among the school children of the state.

This money goes into the common school fund, and each of the 536,195 school children in the seventy-seven counties in the state will receive \$1 per capita for educational purposes.

Oklahoma county leads with 18,294 school children, and receives \$18,294 from the common school fund. Pottawatomie county is second with 16,271 school children; Muskogee county third with 15,328 children the scholastic age. Tulsa county only has 8,767 school children.

The above figures are from the scholastic population compiled by R. H. Wilson, state superintendent of public instruction for the scholastic year 1911.

The amounts due each county are transmitted to the county treasurer in each of the seventy-seven counties prior to February 1, each year, and the distribution is being made now as fast as the funds are received.—Oklahoman.

To Call a Special Session at Once.

Oklahoma City, Jan. 24.—There now seems to be practically no question that a special session of the legislature will be called immediately following the regular session for the purpose of dividing the state into congressional districts.

Members of the legislature maintain that this would not be necessary if action were taken by congress early enough to allow the appointment to be made at the regular session. It had been thought that the multiplicity of candidates for congress among the members of the legislature would serve to retard the work of redistricting but it is possible that it may have the opposite effect, as the candidates can not get together, of course, and the members who have no personal interests to serve are expecting to run the band wagon over the candidates in some cases deliberately shattering long-cherished ambitions.

Oklahoma will probably be allowed three new congressmen, increasing from five to eight.
