LIGHT AND WATER BONDS CARRY.

The election Monday to vote additional bonds for the extension and improvement of the water and light systems, carried by the necessary majority, which proves again that Beaver residents are fully alive and awake to the best interests of the town, and are not going to hold back on legitimate expense, even though it does go a little high at times. It was clearly evident to all that the voting of the additional bonds at this time was extremely necessary, for, if we are going to have water and lights at all, we want them all the time, and the present equipment was inadequate to meet the demands. We understand that immediate attention will be given to enlarging the plant, and that the extension of the lights and water will follow as soon as practicable.

SERIOUSLY HURT BY FALL.

Boel Bradshaw, brakeman on the B. M. & E. was quite seriously injured by a fall, Tuesday afternoon. He was assisting a fireman in taking water for the engine at the crane at Forgan and overreached himself, losing balance and falling forcibly to the ground. He fell on his head and shoulders, being rendered unconscious by the fall and breaking his collar bone. He was hurried to the Beaver hospital, where repairs were made and he is now resting easy at his home in this city.
