JAPANESE LOSE ON LAND

Seizure of Manchurian Railway
is Boldly Attempted.

JAPS AGAIN WIN ON THE SEA

**Russians Have Decided to Aban-
don Port Arthur and Leave
it to its Fate.**

London, Feb. 17.—According to Port
Arthur advices received by the London
Times, a Japanese landing party which
attempted to seize the Manchurian Rail-
way near Kinchau, was driven off after
severe fighting with heavy loss.

That the battle was of a severe char-
acter is indicated by the fact that the
Russian officials admit their loss was
not less than 70 killed. The Russians
allege to have captured 150 Japanese
prisoners.

Port Arthur to be Abandoned.

New York, Feb. 16.—The Sun's Lon-
don cable, dated Feb. 16, says Port
Arthur is to be left by Russia to stand
or fall by herself.

More Russian Ships Sunk.

London, Feb. 16.—Among the dis-
patches from the Far East, published
here this morning, is a report of another
engagement at Port Arthur, in which
the Russians lost eight vessels sunk and
ten captured.

In a night attack on Port Arthur three
Japanese torpedo boats were sunk.

MUST PASS QUARANTINE.

**Otherwise California Cattle Can-
not Enter State.**

The drouth in Southern California is
threatening many cattle, but they will
not be received on the Oregon ranges
unless they can pass the strictest quar-
antine regulations according to the de-
cision of Governor Chamberlain in a re-
ply to the Governor of California ask-
ing admission of Southern California
cattle to this state.

In speaking of his position Governor
Chamberlain said:

"It is with great reluctance that I re-
fuse this request from California. Their
ranges are poor this year, and they have
not enough feed to keep their cattle
alive until their crops are ready. But
we have too look out for our own in-
terests and I do not deem it safe. I
have consulted with the state veteri-
narian, William McLean, and with Sec-
retary of State, F. I. Dunbar, and they
agree with me that it would be hazar-
dous to allow the herds from Southern
California to invade our ranges."

The presence of a tick, peculiar to the
cattle of the South, is the reason for the
decision reached in case of the request
from California. Southern cattle do not
seem to notice the presence of the in-
sect, and their health is not impaired
by any number of them.

Upon Northern cattle the bite of this
tick is regarded as almost fatal. It is
said by veterinarians to cause a disease
known as the Texas fever, from which
cattle in the North seldom recover.
Southern cattle seem to be immune
from this disease, but as soon as the
ticks infest the Northern cattle, the dis-
ease breaks out among them with
usually fatal results.

The Domestic Animal Commission in
Oregon is composed of Governor Cham-
berlain, Secretary of State F. I. Dun-
bar and Chairman of the State Agri-
cultural Society, George Chandler.

"The majority of the board is now
decided not to grant this request," said
the Governor. "It would be very hard

Meet in Portland.**

Republicans will hold their next state
convention in Portland, Thursday, April
14.

Each county will be represented by
one delegate at-large, one for every 150
votes cast for Judge Bean in the last
general election and one for every frac-
tion of 150 larger than 100.

The total number of delegates will be
361. In 1902 the total was 343 and in
1900, 336, on the same basis of appor-
tionment.

The State Committee recommends to
County Committees April 2 for pri-
maries and April 7 for conventions.

Conventions of the two Congression-
al Districts are usually held the day be-
fore the State convention.

A notable gathering of nobles was the
meeting of the Republican State Cen-
tral Committee Friday morning in the
office of Chairman Frank C. Baker.
Fifteen of the 33 members were present
and nine others were represented by
proxies.

The Committee decided that the State
Convention can well be held later than
usual this year, inasmuch as the cam-
paign need not be long. The law re-
quires nominees to file their acceptances
of nomination at least 45 days before
the election.

The nominations will be:

Supreme Judge.

Dairy and Food Commissioner.

Four Presidential electors.

Eight delegates to the National Con-
vention at Chicago June 21; four at
large and two for each congressional
district and eight alternates.

The dates recommended for primaries
and County Conventions are not bind-
ing on the county organizations.
