## FREIGHTERS VALDEZ AND JUNEAU WILL SOON BE HERE

VESSELS JUST ACQUIRED FOR  
ALASKA ROUTE WILL PASS  
THROUGH THE CANAL.

Superintendent Pierson, of the Alaska Steamship Company, who has just returned to Seattle from the East where he had been called by business in connection with the alterations of the company's new freighters Bennington and Burlington, is reported to have said that the freighters would leave Philadelphia for the Pacific Coast about February 1.

The alterations will consist of the installation of condensers, heating systems, new stern frames, new rudders, hatches masts and winches.

Mr. Pierson said that the two vessels will take shipments of general merchandise at Philadelphia and as they will not draw more than eighteen feet of water will be able to come to this coast via the Panama Canal.

Capt. Fred Warner of the steamer Alameda, will be master of the Bennington, and C. B. McMullen of the steamer Dora, will be master of the steamer Burlington during their voyages to this coast. Sam Codling, chief engineer of the freighter Edith, will have charge of the engine room of the Bennington and Roy Bruce, of the steamer Dolphin, will be in charge of the engine rooms of the Burlington.

The steamer Bennington will be known as the Valdez and the steamer Burlington as the Juneau when they steam from Philadelphia for Seattle.

## NEW LIFESAVING TUG IS PLANNED

CANADA TO PLACE VESSEL  
ON THE WEST COAST OF  
VANCOUVER ISLAND

VICTORIA, Dec. 27.—In an effort to prevent a repetition of the Carelmapu, the Canadian government is planning to establish a chain of life saving stations from Barkley sound, where the Banfield power lifeboat is stationed, to Quatsina sound and along the shores of the Queen Charlotte islands.

The advisability of maintaining a lifesaving tug similar in type to the United States coast guard cutter Snohomish is also being considered by the Canadian government authorities.

Manager R. C. Hill, of the Seattle Merchants' Exchange and the United States coast guard service in Seattle Monday were asked for a description of the Snohomish and the possibility of a Canadian lifesaving tug establish a systematic patrol of the west coast of Vancouver Island, which is known as the "graveyard of the Pacific." If the craft is built she will be stationed at Banfield creek, but will spend most of her time in patroling the coast.

Seattle shipping men are greatly interested in the plans of their neighbors on the North to maintain additional lifesaving stations and lifesaving tug on the west coast of Vancouver island. There is danger of American vessels as well as those of other flags losing their way off Cape Flattery in foggy weather or being driven on the Vancouver island shore, and shipping men all along the coast are taking a deep interest in the plans of the Canadian authorities.

Since the wreck of the Chilean ship Carelmapu, with a loss of nineteen lives the establishment of a patrol service on the west coast of Vancouver island is being urged. Shipping men emphasize the need of a lifesaving craft capable of taking a sailing vessel like the Carelmapu in tow and saving her from destruction on the rocky shore.

## WOMEN TALK OF STREET UNIFORM

The standardizing of street dress for women and the adoption of one style that will last for five years and not look conspicuous by reason of its cut, were recommendations of Helen Louise Johnson, chairman of the General economics committee of the General Federation of Women's Club of Pittsburgh, in an address on "Living on the Budget Plan" before the organization in the Fort Pitt Hotel.

"Men can do this. Why cannot women?" she asked. "The stage is said to be setting the style for women today. The rapidly changing styles of their dress has become an economic question, and these changes come so rapidly that manufacturers cannot afford to make up great quantities of clothes and the workers are idle for weeks at a time awaiting the next change in fashion. Work has ceased to be steady in great clothing factories."

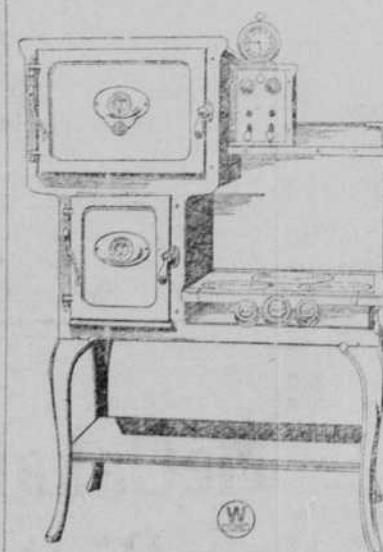
