ONE hundred and thirty-five deaths on the coroner's book in Chicago on the 18th inst., with the thermometer ranging between 85 and 95 degrees. With the thermometer at 110 degrees in Arizona people only suffer from profuse perspiration, with no sunstrokes.

The Phenix Gazette has changed hands, Messrs. Fickas and Farish retiring and Mr. John O. Dunbar assuming the management. The paper has been purchased by a syndicate of Democrats and will hereafter be run in the interest of the "grand old party." We welcome the change.

Close upon the heels of a new earthquake at Bavispe, came the details of a still greater calamity at Baccara, a town twelve miles from Bavispe. It had, before the catastrophe, twelve hundred inhabitants. When Bavispe was destroyed, Baccara was badly shaken, and since then has been visited by a succession of shocks which reduced it to ruins, but most of the people escaped to the country, terror-stricken.

The Hoop and Horn says: Judge Joseph Birchett, of Payson, and Em. Chilson, the well-known horseman, have determined to solve the butter problem by the establishment of a first-class dairy at their ranch in Tonto Basin. When it is considered that not less than \$25,000 leave Northern Arizona annually for California butter, one can scarcely doubt but what home dairy ranching on a business and practical basis will well remunerate those who engage in it.

A special dispatch from the City of Mexico under date of July 18th, says that Lee Bryant and Louis Stransberger, both of El Paso, are under arrest at the City of Mexico for a gold brick game. Stransberger was taken on the spot, but Bryant was captured some distance up the road and brought back. The bricks were sold to several wealthy Mexicans for \$20,000 and it is understood only a small portion of the money was recovered. The men under arrest are well known in El Paso. Both having made their headquarters there for years. Lee Bryant formerly owned and operated the Rancho saloon in Paso Del Norte and Louis Stransberger was a partner of Charlie Boyd in the old National Theatre. Bryant has been spending the winter at Vera Cruz and was on his way home at the time he was arrested. Stransberger was a habitue of Holland's place on the other side and worked with Harry Williams.
