EAST SIDE SHACKS TO BE REMOVED SOON

Unightly Buildings Along The River Bank To Be Replaced By Town Park.

The unsightly frame buildings on the East Side abutting on the river front and which have been an eye sore to visitors and residents, are soon to be removed, and the area now occupied is to be converted into a town park.

Mayor Minson expects to have this improvement accomplished during the month of September.

The new Town Hall and fire house, facing the park, will also soon be under construction which will add materially to the appearance of that locality.

CORPORATION COMMISSION HOLDS HEARING IN CLIFTON

In the Superior Court room on Saturday afternoon last, Hon. A. A. Betts and Hon. David Johnson, two members of the Arizona Corporation Commission, held a public hearing on the application of the Mountain Auto Co., for a license of necessity and convenience to operate an auto service on schedule time between Clifton and Safford, between Clifton and Morenci, and between Clifton and Metcalf.

The application for the license was contested by Candler & Webster insofar as it applied to Clifton and Safford on the ground that this firm was at present giving good service and that there was not sufficient traffic to support more than one line.

John Webster appeared for the Candler & Webster line and called Sam Abraham of the Clifton Hotel and Anton Jacobson of the Olive Hotel at Safford to support his claim.

The Mountain Auto Company was represented by Attorney H. A. Elliott and Mr. P. Anderson, Chickery Sawai and Mr. Tilley appeared as witnesses in support of the application for license.

After hearing the testimony the Commission took the matter under advisement and departed Tuesday morning by auto for Safford.

Army Trucks For State Work

Two Kelly trucks, with a capacity of three and one-half tons each, arrived in Clifton Thursday evening and were driven to the state road camp on Saturday morning. These trucks were formerly the property of the government during the war period and have been allotted to the several states as surplus equipment. Greenlee county's proportion of the Arizona allotment is twenty. The remainder of these trucks will be here shortly and will be used on county highway work.

City Hall Plans Accepted

At a special meeting of the Town Council held Friday evening the plans for the new Town Hall were accepted and the contract will be let shortly. Bids will be opened on September 22nd.

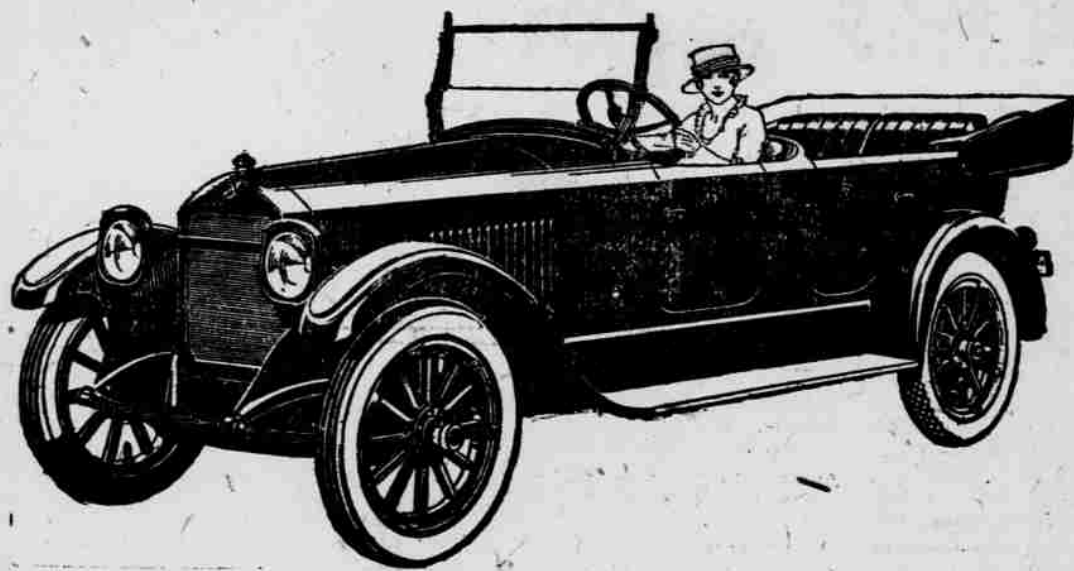

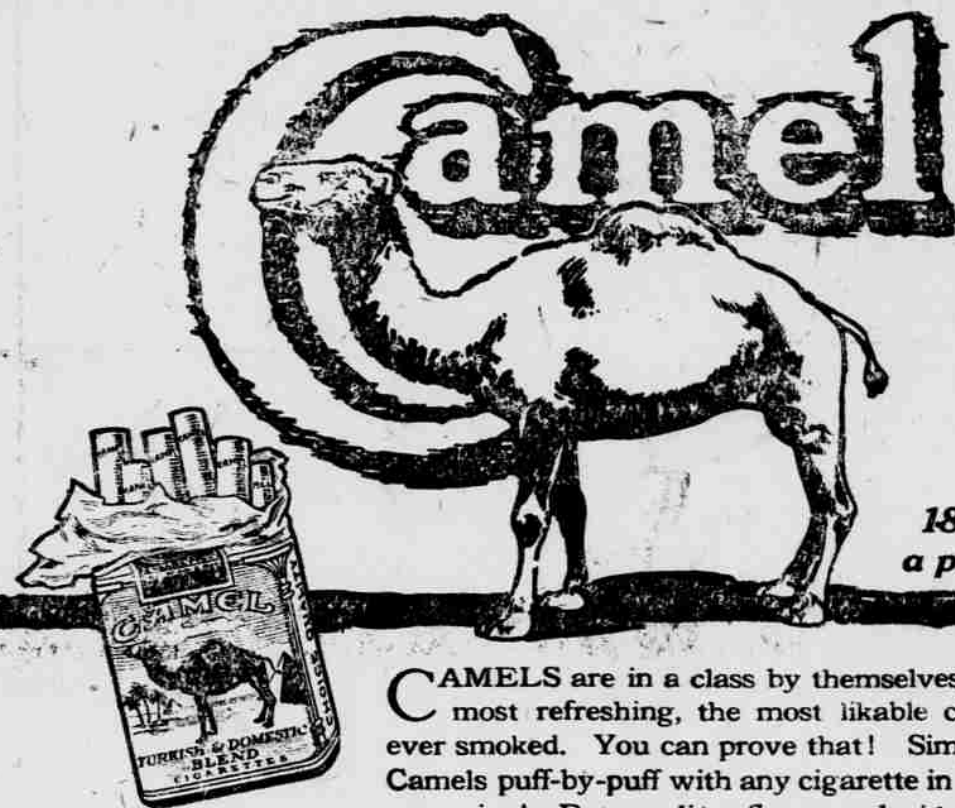
