Health Report

(E. A. Green, Public Health Nurse)

School District No. 7, for September: defective vision, 47; defective hearing, 12; enlarged tonsils, 187; defective teeth, 16.

The children as a rule, were in a good and healthy condition. The large number of enlarged tonsils found does not mean that children must have them removed, as that is a matter for doctors and families to decide. In cases of defective vision, hearing and vaccination, parents are asked to have children taken to a physician as soon as possible.

But few children are absent on account of sickness; the school on the whole is fine, the children are neat and tidy and clean their teeth daily. At the White Oaks, Rabenton and Parsons schools, the same good condition of school and pupils exists. At Rabenton a little girl was found in need of treatment for a deformity, whom the County may be in a position to help, shortly. On the whole, the County schools are in good condition, the teachers kind and attentive. The defections mentioned are of no larger percentage than found in other counties. I find the work very interesting.
