ORK SOON TO COMMENCE

West Liberty Street, and This Will be Followed by the Paving of Other Thoroughfares Until the Entire City is Paved.

The crusher recently purchased by City Council has "got busy," and in the past two or three days has been doing good service near the Gulf and Gulf railroad depot, and it has been placed in commis-

sion. The material to be used in the construction of West Liberty street is the finest grade of flint rock, and comes from the Cannon quarries, Rocky Point. Several carloads of the material have already been delivered, and the same is unloaded from the car direct into the crusher bin, making only a short transfer. The material is said to be the finest for surface work in the state.

The foundation of the street will be some soft substance, probably Alabama rock, which will be laid for a thickness of about four inches. The roughfare will be surfaced with the material, which will make a hard, most durable and lasting roadway.

The street committee, of which Councilman W. B. Taylor is chairman, is fully alive to the necessity of good streets, and it was largely through the influence and work of this committee, which is comprised of Councilmen Taylor, Hodges and Cushman, that the expenditure for street-building machinery was made. It was an expenditure, however, which will prove great benefit to the masses, as good streets are enjoyed and appreciated by all alike.

As soon as a sufficient quantity of rock is crushed a force will be put to work grading the street, and the paving "gang" will immediately follow.

It will require some time, but the people who have the matter in hand are determined to have good streets, which is one of the most essential improvements of any progressive town or city.

THE YELLOW FEVER.

Many New Cases at Pensacola and Several Deaths—New Orleans.

Pensacola, September 26.—Since last night the fever has been gaining, 25 new cases being reported yesterday and one death, with four new cases up to noon today and two deaths. The people are anxious to leave town for safety, but the detention camp is not ready. Several men on board vessels are reported sick with fever.

At New Orleans.

New Orleans, September 26.—From 8 p. m. yesterday until noon today there were 11 new cases and no deaths. With September nearly gone, the yellow fever is well under control.

At Other Points.

A case of fever is reported from Brent, four miles from Pensacola, and a suspicious case at Milton.

In Mississippi there are new cases at Natchez, Vicksburg, Gulfport, Mississippi City and Roxie.
